#### Across the Editor's Desk





#### **Book Series Review:**

#### Jack Colby - Car detective and classic car collector and restorer; author Amy Myers



I recently came across a topical murder mystery author. Amy Meyers has written a number of mysteries with a story line that intertwines a good old-fashioned murder with the collector car and restoration hobbies. Her main protagonist is Jack Colby, a car collector, hobbyist, and owner of Frog's Hill Restorations. Jack consults with the car crimes division of the local constabulary to help pay the bills. Collector cars, many of them Classics, figure in the stories. The setting is Kent, England, and apparently the collecting community there is a more bloodthirsty crowd than I've met been exposed to in St. Louis. Plenty of murder and mayhem to keep me engaged for 200 pages. Some of the cars included in the series are a 1935 Auburn Speedster, a 1938 V12 Lagonda, a 1907 De Dion Bouton, or a 30's Packard Saloon or Alfa Romeo. These are good vacation reads and a bit quicker than those by Dame Agatha. No one does mystery like the English and adding the car themes is the whipped cream on the sundae. There are eight books so far in the series and the titles include: Classic in the Barn, Classic Mistake, and Classic in the Clouds.
